How Ordering Works in the United States

Ordering controlled medication in the United States requires steps that protect patient safety and follow federal rules. **Lorazepam** is a Schedule IV controlled drug, so a valid prescription is required and pharmacies must verify every order before dispensing.

Prescription verification and Schedule IV compliance

Your provider may e-prescribe to a participating pharmacy or you can request an Rx transfer. Pharmacies confirm identity, review dose, quantity, and refills, and may ask for extra information if anything is unclear.

Eligibility for clinical/EMS or bulk orders and required authorization

Clinical uses and how it helps
